A return to his birthplace, Smyrna, saw him appointed manager of the Imperial Ottoman Bank there, before he was 21. Subsequently, Mr Barker went to Constantinople, and became one of the founders of the Societe Ottoman de Change et de Valeurs, of which he was an active managing director until 1895. He took a part in the financial negotiations at the time of the Russo-Turkish War. Mr Barker subsequently became representative of the British Government upon the Council of the Ottoman Public Debt and retained the position until Sir Edgar Vincent's appointment. Born at Smyrna in 1883, the son of W H Cadoux, he was educated in London, and from 1902 to 1911 served in the Admiralty's victualling department. But this was not his true vocation, and in 1911 he went to Mansfield College, Oxford to be trained for the ministry. But the practical social work which takes so much of the average minister's life was never his. The only pastoral charge he had during his long career was when he superintended for two years a village church in Oxfordshire while serving as tutor at Mansfield College. From Mansfield he went to Yorkshire United Independent College as Professor of New Testament Criticism, Exegis and Theology, and of Christian Sociology. While in Bradford he lectured on the Bible not only to students but to the general public, and these lectures constituted an outstanding feature of his work. He also preached at the week-ends, but he could never be called a popular preacher. It was to the few and the thoughtful who could appreciate the results of his wide reading and of his deep devotion that he appealed. Although his last posts were in Europe, he was most happy, most at home, in Turkey, where he spent long periods both before and after the First World War. He spoke the language admirably, and his abilities and his calmness, patience and good humour carried him through some very difficult times, especially in Smyrna, after the Greek debacle. If there was a gold medal for reliability, Edmonds would have received it very early in his official life.
