In Memoriam

Hendrick Dutilh of Izmir, age 93, prominent businessman of many years, passed away on 29th September 2022 peacefully.

Born in 1929, from a Levantine family of French / Dutch origin, Hendrik Dutilh was amongst the veteran names of the maritime and tourism sectors of Izmir, along with his older brother Karel Dutilh, who passed away in 2013.

The Dutilh brothers had the title of tax record holder in Turkey for 6 times and İzmir 11 times until they retired in 2000. – further information on this family origins:
