Quote: Historian Eugene Rogan explains one of the most poorly understood aspects of the First World War – the defeat of the Ottomans and the clearing of the way for a new Middle East that has endured until today. The Ottoman Empire was one of the most powerful states in Europe and ruled the Middle East but had weakened significantly by 1914. Rogan explains how Britain, France and Russia decided to finish off the empire by invading Gallipoli after the Ottomans joined the Central Powers. Rogan teaches the modern history of the Middle East at the University of Oxford. His book, Frontiers of the State in the Late Ottoman Empire, won the Albert Hourani Prize. 

Istanbul, Turkey and the Arnold Family, 1860 to 1924 I grew up in a bay side suburb of Melbourne, Victoria, Australia and as long as I can remember I have possessed a great fondness for Istanbul and Turkey. Always proud knowing that my Mother Kathleen Dorothy Arnold was born in Haydarpasa [Haidar Pasha] on 20 May 1915 and my Grandfather, Cyril Henry Arnold and Great Grandfather, Edward Thomas Arnold were also born in Constantinople [Istanbul]. I understood that the Arnold Family were involved with the English Cemetery at Haydarpasa and that another Great Grandfather, Philip Le Feuvre was a diver who help raise the Russian Fleet at Sevastopol in the Crimea.

- ♣ Chris Horner was recently able to electronically scan the diary of Donald Andrus, who came out from England to Smyrna in 1889 to work as an assistant engineer on the Smyrna-Aidin (Ottoman) railway under Edward Purser, and eventually married Purser's second daughter, Sarah (sister of Chris' great grandmother, Dora). The diary was kept almost daily from 1889-1890, and then less frequently between 1893 and 1903. Descendants of Donald Andrus and Sarah Purser in Toronto, Canada, kindly allowed Chris to scan the original of the diary and gave permission for it to appear on the LHF site.
- ♣ Chris has given us several files of this diary which are being uploaded onto our Levantine Heritage family recollections.
- ♣ But furthermore today Chris informs us that he also obtained in 2014 the actual physical diaries of Edward Purser, from another relative in Canada, who is also a descendant of Dora Purser (Edward's oldest daughter) and Henry de Jongh. These diaries consist of a formidable collection of 35 bound volumes, stretching from 1862 to 1904 with virtually daily entries in a quite difficult-to-read handwriting. Chris is up to the volume for 1872, and reports that so far the overwhelming majority of entries concern the building of the railway, in its engineering, business-related and political aspects. The descendants would love to see excerpts from this Purser diary on the LHF site along with the Andrus diary, where they say, these materials can be viewed by many people, and in the context of all the other recollections and resources which we have assembled on LHF website.
 - ♣ Our colleague Dr George Vassiadis who has already done some research on the 'Smyrna Aïdin railway families' will conduct further studies with Chris, but we would welcome all cooperation from any other parties who may have even more material on the Pursers in particular.
