 the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased -
 he having been first sworn duly to Administer
 power was of making the like grant to John

 may become due unto me for His
 Majesty's Service or for my service on Board
 any ship or vessel in His Majesty's
 in the Merchant Ship or vessel in the
 Merchant's Service to which I heretofore have

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under 31st December 1794 makes it appear that the said
 amount shall may be placed for the sole use and
 benefit and advantage of my daughter Mary
 Elizabeth in the same manner as under

 servants actually in my service to each
 Dollars one hundred of parts forty each but
 to my said servants an amount of the
 long services to my daughter and each of
 her I have and I bequeath her Dollars
 one hundred to be paid her annually every
 six months at Dollars fifty the Dollars one
 hundred to be paid her as the other my
 share as the other my said and other
 servants is not to be included in this and
 and this during her life and all this to
 be paid them as soon as they can
 conveniently be seen and over and above
 of what due to each of them for their
 salaries or wages to thirty days after
 my death I have and I bequeath to the

liability for it it being then her sole
husband's duty to provide and maintain her
when I will that said Dollars to said devolve
to my Daughter Mary Elizabeth Abbott
fortune and her Annuity wife shall in that
case of remarrying have no claim pretensions
title or right whatever to any thing of mine
except to her Wearing Apparels Coats Jewells
and Trinkets I may have made or purchased
her with during my life secondly I have and
bequeath to my now only child and Daughter
Mary Elizabeth Abbott all my Estate be it in
Money Goods effects obligations bonds in praesentia
with its Gardens grounds houses furniture
her in plate Jewells Stocks in the funds in

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under care of Mr. John St. Richard and
William Lee Francis principal and son and George
prior as shall have management of accounts
of mine under their hands or sure of the said
shall so have Dollars two thousand to at most
Dollars two thousand five hundred money of
the Grand Signor to her or her steward for said
girl yearly for her straitwaite clothing
schooling and boarding with her if living or to
sure as may board or lodge with recommending
earnestly to her steward or to those with
whom she may be that she be instructed in
the way and fear of God according to the Church
of England and in all worldly Qualifications
becoming her sex and condition but should her
steward be dead which God forbid then in lieu
of Dollars two thousand five hundred to allow
her Dollars four thousand yearly for the said
allowance for living dowry and this allowance
to be continued for untill she become of
age when she shall be going to England
in company and care of some sedate honest
fit person of her sex if possible recommended to
either or to all in Court my above mentioned
worthy friends and patrons and to my sister
in law Mrs. Mariana Abbott in London that
they and she do me and the child the charity of
accepting the trouble of her living either with
her or any of the aforesaid Court as all
having families for being under their care for
giving her as best education as become her
condition and state for settling which when
with them and that she may not be of the
least charge or expense to them a certain
sum of pounds sterling be allowed for her as
shall be thought by her and them fully
sufficient and reasonable to whomsoever has
her under their care to serve for her straitwaite
for lodging and boarding her clothing
schooling and being attended also that of a
staid servant to attend her when for which
in lieu of the Dollars mentioned above want
at Constantinople she be allowed pounds one
hundred and fifty to two hundred sterling
as may seem best to my said friends and
Guardians for said ends but should these
sums not be thought sufficient for said ends
