George Baker, b.1823 was an apprentice at Kew and later took employment under the Office of Works in Constantinople, in 1848. He is buried in the Crimean War Cemetery at Scutari, Memorial in the Crimean Church Pera. Maria Butler had two sisters - Mary Jane (Polly) x Fulson (Architect 1857) & Lettice (step) x Percival.
